Lecture/Workshop Suggestions:

<u>Lecture 1</u>: "Israeli Design" – is it a real thing?

In the last few years many people have praised Israeli design...but what are they talking about? Is there really such a thing as Israeli design? And if yes, what are its characteristics? In this survey lecture, we will use famous Israeli design examples from different disciplines in order to address all of the questions.

Lecture 2: "Israeli Pop Art Products" and the secrets behind them

In this lecture we will identify Israeli pop art products, and explore the secret social culture behind their success. What is the trigger and why is it effective? Can we create one too?

<u>Lecture 3: Vase and the Israeli collective memory</u>

This lecture will focus on the interrelationship between the design of a household product and the conceptual idea behind it. Using her own experience she will reflect on her work developing a vase while exploring the Israeli collective memory.

<u>Lecture 4</u>: Earth, Water and everything Israeli in between them

Using samples from two of Cleveland's exhibits*, she will reflect on the key Israeli design concepts of Adama (Earth) and Mayim (Water), as can be found in Israeli products.

*During her visit, there will be two art exhibits in the community about the topic: The Federation exhibit about earth and the icnext 3 photo exhibit about water and blue.

Mini Course - The Eichmann Trial as a case study for Israeli collective and personal memory.

In this mini course we will use the case of the Eichmann trail to explore the Israeli collective and personal memory. We will define personal memory and collective memory and discuss the difference between them, then explore the definition of a witness and how a witness can shape memory. From there we will look at the Israeli collective memory and how the Eichmann Trail shaped it. Last, we will view the Eichmann trial from two different lenses: how do Israelis and non-Israelis relate to it after 50 years.
